Student Eligibility Requirements

- Be classified by the institution as a Texas Resident
- Be registered with Selective Service, or exempt
- Have applied for any available financial aid assistance
- Have financial need
- Have a 9-month student aid index (SAI) of no more than \$6514
- Be enrolled at least $\frac{1}{2}$ time as an undergraduate student in an associate degree or certificate program at a 2-year institution
- Not have earned an associate or baccalaureate degree
- Not be concurrently receiving TEXAS grant
- Not have been convicted of any felony or any offense under the law of any jurisdiction involving controlled substances as defined by Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code (Texas Controlled Substance Act.)
- Not be 30 days or more delinquent paying obligated child support per Texas Family Code, Title 5 sec. 231.006

Renewal year eligibility requirements:

- Priority Deadline for eligible students wishing to receive renewal monies is March 15

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP):

First Renewal Award: students must meet the Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements set by the institution.

Second Renewal Award: (and any year afterwards) students must complete 75% of total attempted hours and have a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA or its equivalent.

First Year Appeals: If a student completes the first year on academic warning, probation, or on an approved plan, the student can be considered meeting SAP if the institution's policy includes such provisions. However, at the end of the second year, the student must meet the program SAP requirements for continued eligibility, unless deemed eligible by the institution under a hardship provision.

Summer SAP Requirements: if a student receives a summer state grant, summer coursework will be used to calculate SAP for fall eligibility. If a student does not receive summer state grant, summer classes may be used to re-establish eligibility if they failed SAP requirements. Summer coursework not funded by state grants should not be used to recalculate SAP if the attempted credits will result in a student losing eligibility for the fall term.

GPA Requirements: A student who does not meet the GPA requirements at the end of the academic year may appeal to have courses taken at other institutions included in the GPA calculation. In this case, all grade points previously earned must be included in the overall GPA calculation. If the resulting GPA meets or exceeds the program's academic requirement, an otherwise ineligible student may receive an award in the following term.

Hardship Provision: A student who is ineligible, based on GPA or completion rate for Satisfactory Academic Progress or enrollment less than half-time, may be deemed eligible under a hardship provision at the end of an academic year. The institution determines acceptable reasons to grant a hardship decision. All hardship decisions must be documented.

Discontinuation of Eligibility: Unless an extension of eligibility (due to hardship circumstance) is granted, a student's eligibility ends if any of the following maximums have been met or the student earns an associate degree, whichever comes first:

Attempted hours are defined as every course in every semester for which a student has been registered, as of the official census date for that semester, regardless of whether TEOG fund were used to pay those courses. This includes, but is not limited; to repeated courses, courses the student drops, or those that the student withdraws. For transfer students, the transfer hours (including dual credit) and hours for optional internship and cooperative education courses are included if they are accepted by the receiving institution towards the student's current program of study.
